A new comparative study from Ph.D. candidate Maya Alkateb-Chami finds strong correlation between low literacy outcomes for children and schools teaching in different language from home. Education systems around the world are failing to develop basic literacy skills in almost half of young learners, according to the World Bank a situation that has only worsened because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Now new research illuminates a growing problem related to declining global literacy rates: a mismatch between the language that students speak at home and the language of instruction used in schools.

ASCD's whole child commitment has helped change the definition of a successful learner "from one whose achievement is measured solely by academic tests to one who is knowledgeable, emotionally and physically healthy, civically inspired, engaged in the arts, prepared for work and economic self-sufficiency, and ready for the world beyond formal schooling"

A Tool to Encourage Students to Respect the Dignity of Their Classmates

No matter how hard we might try, the polarized climate outside of our classrooms still seeps into them. This climate pushes our students into usversus-them thinking, toward less careful and open listening and a higher degree of tension and anxiety from walking around in what can be a hostile environment due to relentless bullying. The Dignity Index asks students to reflect on their thoughts about others and their willingness to listen to those with different views.
